Action Teams for Partnerships (ATP)

- The ATP training was created to assist schools in developing partnerships between schools, parents and community to foster student achievement.
 - ATP meets the qualification for Title I schools parent involvement, and will aid schools in reaching their adequate yearly progress (AYP) goals.
 - Attendees will be trained on the basic components of the National Network for Partnership Schools (NNPS) model, how to create effective partnerships that support student achievement, how to write a goal-oriented plan for their ATP and how to strengthen parent involvement as a result of ATP.

Who should attend?

- ATPs should have a minimum of three team members and the team is required to attend the training together. *One member of the ATP must be a parent (i.e.: PTA representative or Parent Liaison).* All participants will receive a parent resource center start-up kit, after the completion of the training and the implementation of their action plan.

Training & Technical Assistance

- Training participants will be eligible to receive on-site assistance to support their action plan. OKPIRC staff will work with school sites to incorporate school site goals, including benchmarks for adequate yearly progress.

Parent Resource Center Kits

- Each school site will be eligible to receive a start-up kit to create an on-site parent resource room or center. Title I schools and schools on the Year 1, 2, or 3 needs improvement list will receive additional support based on the school's need.
